 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

RICK HARVEY
 RT 1 BOX 69
 TYGH VALLEY, OR 97063

confirms the right to use the waters of TYGH CREEK, a tributary of WHITE RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 0.5 ACRE.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for WascoWasco County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 7, at Page 196. The date of priority is 1877 for Tract 1.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre during the irrigation season (with the further limitations contained in paragraph 24 of said decree); if available at the original point of diversion; NE¹/₄ SW¹/₄, Section 3, T4S, R13E, WM; 910 feet South and 1010 feet West from the Center of Section 3 (Bonney Ditch).

The point of diversion is located as follows:


