confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-652. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point(s) of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: MCKAY CREEK, A TRIBUTARY OF THE UMATILLA RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 4.0 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.05 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, IF AVAILABLE AT THE ORIGINAL POINT OF DIVERSION, SW 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 16, T 2 N, R 32 E, W.M.; OR ITS EQUIVALENT IN CASE OF ROTATION, MEASURED AT THE POINT OF DIVERSION

DATE OF PRIORITY: MAY 3, 1911

The points of diversion are located as follows:

2 N	32 E	WM	16	NW NW	GOLTER POD (NEW ADDITIONAL) - 600 FEET SOUTH AND 490 FEET EAST FROM NW CORNER, SECTION 16

The use shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the new additional point of diversion, together with that diverted at the original point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain, in good working order, a totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director at each new point of diversion.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where any meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The water user shall maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted.

The water user shall operate and maintain the fish screen at the new point of diversion consistent with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm an ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered JANUARY 29, 2015, at Special Order Volume 93, Page 1206, approving Transfer Application T-11773, supersedes Certificate 84250, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
