The amount of water used for irrigation together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 3.0 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional points of appropriation, together with that diverted at the original points of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of appropriation.

Water use measurement conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meters or measuring devices, as approved by the Director, in good working order, at each point of appropriation (new and existing).
- B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on lands or place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm ADDITIONAL POINTS OF APPROPRIATION AND CHANGE IN PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered November 27, 2018, at Special Order Volume 109, Page 1066, approving Transfer Application T-12807, and together with Certificates 95099 and 94132, supercedes Certificate 67672, State record of Water Right Certificates.
