CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-23654. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point(s) of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: WILLIAMSON RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF UPPER KLAMATH LAKE

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 4.9 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.12 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: JUNE 30, 1955

The point of diversion is located as follows:

34 S	7 E	WM	22	SW SE	8	POINT OF DIVERSION (NEW) - 1360 FEET SOUTH AND 190 FEET EAST OF CENTER 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 22

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 3.0 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the original point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion described as follows:

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Water use measurement conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director in good working order at each new point of diversion.
- B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The water user shall operate and maintain the fish screen at the point of diversion consistent with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that Oregon Water Resources Department (OWRD) regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights.

This certificate is issued to confirm changes in POINT OF DIVERSION and PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered MAY 27, 2015, at Special Order Volume 95, Page 877, approving Transfer Application T-11917, and together with Certificate 90137, supersedes a portion of Certificate 65750, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
