confirms the right to use the waters of WEST FORK ILLINOIS RIVER, a tributary of ILLINOIS RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 35.5 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-16346. The date of priority is MAY 24, 1945. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.71 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FIFTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated throughout the irrigation season from April 1st to November 1st of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.
