CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

GEO. W. DUNN
ASHLAND, OR 97520

confirms the right to use the waters of ALTHOUSE CREEK, a tributary of the ILLINOIS RIVER for the IRRIGATION of 90.0 ACRES of land, DOMESTIC, and STOCK USE.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Josephine County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 4, at Page 427. The date of priority is 1858.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 1.8 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:


