 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

confirms the right to use the waters of ROGUE RIVER for MUNICIPAL USE.

This right was perfected under Permit S-7325. The date of priority is JULY 12, 1924. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 3.0 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The use hereunder for irrigation shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of rotation.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:



This certificate is issued in accordance with OAR 690-380-6010 to describe the water right for a non-completed change in point of diversion approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered May 30, 2006, at Special Order Volume 68, Page 565, approving Transfer Application T-9615 and supersedes Certificate 9704, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
