CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

L. M. MARLATT
MILTON-FREEWATER

confirms the right to use the waters of A WELL within the PINE CREEK basin for irrigation of 7.58 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-464. The date of priority is DECEMBER 4, 1956. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.09 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 ACRE-FEET per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.


