confirms the right to use the waters of WILLOW CREEK, a tributary to the Columbia River, in Gilliam County, Oregon, for the purpose of IRRIGATION of 17.8 ACRES (during the irrigation season).

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Morrow County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 1, at Page 73. The priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from 1892 for the IRRIGATION of 10.0 ACRES and 1907 for the IRRIGATION of 7.8 ACRES.

The amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed for the purpose aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purpose, and shall not exceed 0.17 cubic foot per second as of date 1892 and 0.13 cubic foot per second as of date 1907.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Water use measurement conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meters or other suitable measuring devices as approved by the Director in good working order at each new point of diversion.
- B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen at the new points of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.


The quantity of water diverted at the new points of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion described as follows:

The right to use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in any related decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm changes in POINTS OF DIVERSION, PLACE OF USE, and a PARTIAL CANCELLATION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered APRIL 30, 2016, at Special Order Volume 100, Page 342, approving Transfer Application T-12130, and supersedes Certificate 140, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
