CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-11192. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point(s) of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: SOUTH FORK JOHN DAY RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF JOHN DAY RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 1.5 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.035 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS) PRIOR TO JUNE 1, AND THEREAFTER 0.0175 CFS

DATE OF PRIORITY: FEBRUARY 23, 1934

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated prior to June 1, and thereafter ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second for each acre irrigated, or its equivalent, shall not exceed one acre foot per acre during any month prior to June 1, not exceed a total during the irrigation season from April 1 to September 30, of each year of four acre-feet per acre; and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Water use measurement conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain, in good working order, a totaling flow meter, weir, flume, submerged orifice, or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director, at each point of diversion.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the measuring device; provided however, where the measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The water user shall operate and maintain the fish screens at the points of diversion consistent with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines a screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that Oregon Water Resources Department (OWRD) regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 12096 and any related decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered May 8, 2013, at Special Order Volume 89, Page 636, approving Transfer Application 10938, and together with Certificate 88197, supercedes Certificate 12096, State record of Water Right Certificates.
