CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

confirms the right to use the waters of the SOUTH FORK WALLA WALLA RIVER, a tributary of the WALLA WALLA RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 4.22 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Umatilla County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR, in Volume 12, at Page 9. The date of priority is 1888.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed ONE AND ONE-HALF MINER'S INCHES per acre measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

LEE ROBERTS DITCH.


This certificate is issued in accordance with OAR 690-380-6010 to describe the water right for a non-completed change in point of diversion approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered March 29, 2005, at Special Order Volume 63, Page 515, approving Transfer Application T-8337 and supersedes Certificate 80549, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
