This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Jackson County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 3, at Page 1. The date of priority is 1872.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially and shall not exceed 16.0 CFS FROM APRIL 1 THROUGH OCTOBER 31 and 16.0 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND (CFS) FROM NOVEMBER 1 THROUGH MARCH 31 of each year, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.
