 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of LAKE CREEK, for IRRIGATION OF 8.0 ACRES, DOMESTIC AND STOCK USE.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Jefferson County and the said decree entered at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 9, at Page 362. The date of priority is 1888.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled for the purposes aforesaid is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre measured at the point of diversion from the stream, which may be diverted at a rate of 0.13 cubic foot per second (cfs), not to exceed 1/60<sup>th</sup> of one cubic foot per second, during the irrigation season from May 1 to September 15; and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

Water use measurement conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain, in good working order, a totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director at each new point of diversion.
- B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Prior to October 1, 2014, the water user shall install and maintain an in-flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

Prior to use of the water, the water user shall install and maintain fish screens or fish by-pass devices, as appropriate, at the new points of diversion. The type and plans of the screens or by-pass devices must be approved by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife prior to beginning of construction, and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of diversion together with that diverted at the original points of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion.


The water user shall maintain and operate a fish screening at the additional point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 88891 and any related decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered SEPTEMBER 24, 2018, at Special Order Volume 109, Page 456, approving Transfer Application T-12557, and corrected by an order of the Water Resources Director entered OCTOBER 3, 2018, at Special Order Volume 109, Page 536, and together with Certificate 94033, supersedes Certificate 88891, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
