 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

WILLOW CREEK DISTRICT IMPROVEMENT CO.

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confirms the right to use the waters of WILLOW CREEK, a tributary of the COLUMBIA RIVER for IRRIGATION of 25.8 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Morrow County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 1, at Page 73. The date of priority is 1890.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.43 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-SIXTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season March 1 to September 1 of each year.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Water use measurement conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director in good working order at each new point of diversion.
- B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

In order to avoid enlargement of the right or injury to other rights, it is preferable to have a flowmeter installed that reads instantaneous, totalizes, and has real-time access so the Watermaster can access the flow data. However, if the flowmeter will not work and provide the real time data, the Watermaster can approve an alternative type of measuring device that will provide instantaneous data, totalizes, and will provide real time access to the flow data.


The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of diversion, together with that diverted at the original points of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion. The water user shall maintain a headgate to control and regulate the quantity of water diverted as required by the Department.

The water user shall operate and maintain the fish screen at the new point of diversion consistent with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use herein described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered MARCH 6, 2017, at Special Order Volume 104, Page 37, approving Transfer Application T-11699, and together with Certificate 96672, supersedes Certificate 80055, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
