## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

WILLOW CREEK DISTRICT IMPROVEMENT CO. C/O BRIAN THOMPSON 55805 HWY 74 HEPPNER OR 97836 BRIAN THOMPSON 55805 HWY 74 HEPPNER OR 97836

confirms the right to use the waters of WILLOW CREEK, tributary to COLUMBIA RIVER for IRRIGATION of 39.0 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Morrow County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 1, at Page 73. The date of priority is 1889 for 15.0 acres of irrigation and 1909 for 24.0 acres of irrigation. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.65 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), being 0.25 CFS as of the date 1889 and 0.4 CFS as of 1909, measured at the point of diversion.

The period of use is March 15th to September 15th of each year.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

Water use measurement conditions for WCDIC POD:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director in good working order at each new point of diversion.
- B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

## NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

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The Director may require the water user to install a totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring devices at Points of Diversion 1 and 4. If the Director notifies the water user to install a totalizing flow meter or other measuring devices, the water user shall install such device within the period stated in the notice. Once installed, the water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order and shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional points of diversion, together with that diverted at the original point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion described as follows:

In order to avoid enlargement of the right or injury to other rights, it is preferable to have a flowmeter installed that reads instantaneous, totalizes, and has real-time access so the Watermaster can access the flow data. However, if the flowmeter will not work and provide the real time data, the Watermaster can approve an alternative type of measuring device that will provide instantaneous data, totalizes, and will provide real time access to the flow data.

The water user shall maintain a headgate to control and regulate the quantity of water diverted as required by the Department.

The water user shall operate and maintain the fish screen at the WCDIC POD point of diversion consistent with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.

The water user shall maintain and operate fish screening, at Point of Diversion 4, as required by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered MARCH 6, 2017, at Special Order Volume 104, Page 37, approving Transfer Application T-11699, supersedes Certificate 87877, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
