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confirms the right to use the waters of WILLOW CREEK, tributary to COLUMBIA RIVER for IRRIGATION of 63.5 ACRES AND DOMESTIC.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Morrow County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 1, at Page 73. The date of priority is 1884. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 1.06 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND (cfs), or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion.

The period of use is March 1 through July 1.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Water use measurement conditions for WCDIC POD:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director in good working order at each new point of diversion.
- B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The Director may require the water user to install a totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring devices at Point of Diversion 4. If the Director notifies the water user to install a totalizing flow meter or other measuring devices, the water user shall install such device within the period stated in the notice. Once installed, the water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order and shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices.

The following provisions shall be effective when in the judgement of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices at PODs 1 and 3:

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the water user is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional points of diversion, together with the quantity of diverted at the old points of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water available from the original points of diversion located as follows:

The water user shall maintain a headgate to control and regulate the quantity of water diverted as required by the Department.


The water user shall operate and maintain the fish screen at the WCDIC point of diversion consistent with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.

The water user shall maintain and operate fish screening, at Point of Diversion 4, as required by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered MARCH 6, 2017, at Special Order Volume 104, Page 37, approving Transfer Application T-11699, supersedes Certificate 87878, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
