## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

# THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

ERIC M. POND LAURA R. POND 39303 PLAGMAN DR LEBANON OR 97355

confirms the right to use the waters of SOUTH SANTIAM RIVER, a tributary of SANTIAM RIVER for IRRIGATION of 7.3 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-28481. The date of priority is NOVEMBER 8, 1962.

The amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.089 cubic foot per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Water use measurement conditions:

A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or another suitable measuring device as approved by the Director in good working order at each point of diversion.

B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

## NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The water user shall operate and maintain the fish screen at the new point of diversion consistent with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion (POD 2), shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion described as follows:

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use herein described, and is subject to the existing minimum flow policies established by the Water Policy Review Board.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered JULY 8, 2021, at Special Order Volume 120, Page 1042, approving Transfer Application T-13301, supersedes Certificate 49788, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
