CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-17869. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: BAKER GULCH, A TRIBUTARY OF LITTLE BUTTE CREEK

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 1.5 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.02 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: AUGUST 18, 1947

The point of diversion is located as follows:

35 S	1 E	WM	31	NE SE	1430 FEET NORTH AND 1820 FEET EAST FROM S 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 31

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season from April 2 to October 31 or each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed 0.02 cubic foot per second, and together with that diverted at the old point diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion described as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the water user is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said Watermaster.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described and is subject to the existing minimum flow policies established by the Water Policy Review Board.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered January 26, 1983, at Special Order Volume 37, Page 48, approving Transfer Application T-5170, supercedes Certificate 51135, State record of Water Right Certificates.
