CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-49554. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point(s) of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: JOHN DAY RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF COLUMBIA RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 21.13 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.26 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: SEPTEMBER 13, 1983

The points of diversion are located as follows:

12 S	26 E	WM	7	SE SE	ORIGINAL - 1060 FEET NORTH AND 1150 FEET WEST FROM SE CORNER, SECTION 7
12 S	26 E	WM	6	SW NE	ADDITIONAL - 2920 FEET NORTH AND 3260 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER, SECTION 6

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 5.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. This right is limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land.

This right shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of diversion, together with that diverted at the original point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.


When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

The water user shall maintain a fish screen and fish by-pass device, as appropriate, at the additional point of diversion.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described. The right is subject to minimum flows established by the Water Resources Commission with an effective date prior to this right.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered June 1, 2006, at Special Order Volume 68, Page 658, approving Transfer Application T-8683, and together with Certificate 81942, supercedes Certificate 75792, State record of Water Right Certificates.
