CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to the use of waters as limited and conditioned below. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Grant County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 15, at Page 461.

SOURCE OF WATER: COTTONWOOD CREEK, A TRIBUTARY OF NORTH FORK JOHN DAY RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 7.1 ACRES AND SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 6.9 ACRES

DATE OF PRIORITY: 1895

The point of diversion is located as follows:

9 S	28 E	WM	18	NE SW	POD #3 - 3830 FEET SOUTH AND 1250 FEET WEST FROM N1/4 CORNER, SECTION 18

The amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed ONE-FORTIETH cubic foot per second per acre irrigated to June 1 and ONE-EIGHTIETH cubic foot per second per acre thereafter; further limited to 1.0 acre-foot per calendar month to June 1 and 4.0 acre-feet per acre during season April 1 to September 30, measured at the point of diversion.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion described as follows:

The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter, or other suitable measuring device, as approved by the Director, in good working order. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meter or measuring devices; provided however, where the meter or measuring devices are located with in the private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The water user shall maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted.


The water user shall not construct, operate, or maintain any dam or artificial obstruction to fish passage without obtaining approval from Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW).

The water user shall maintain and operate fish screening consistent with current ODFW standards. Fish screening is to prevent fish from entering the diversion.

Said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree. The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION AND DIMINISHMENT approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered February 6, 2018, at Special Order Volume 107, Page 599, approving Transfer Application T-11973, supercedes Certificate 24910, State record of Water Right Certificates.
