CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to the use of waters as limited and conditioned below. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for DESCHUTES County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 9, at Page 362.

SOURCE OF WATER: LAKE CREEK, A TRIBUTARY OF THE METOLIUS RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: POND MAINTENANCE FOR MULTIPURPOSE USE INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, IRRIGATION, DOMESTIC AND STOCK USES FROM MAY 1 TO SEPTEMBER 15, AND POND MAINTENANCE FOR MULTIPURPOSE USE INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, DOMESTIC AND STOCK USES FROM SEPTEMBER 16 TO APRIL 30

DATE OF PRIORITY: 1888

The point of diversion is located as follows:

Twp	Rng	Mer	Sec	Q-Q	Measured Distances
13 S	9 E	WM	16	NW SE	2120 FEET NORTH AND 1955 FEET WEST FROM SE CORNER, SECTION 16

The use of water for pond maintenance shall not exceed a total quantity diverted of 12.0 acre-feet per year and shall not exceed a rate of diversion of ONE-SIXTIETH of one cubic foot per second during the irrigation season (May 1 to September 15), or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The use of water for pond maintenance shall not exceed a total quantity diverted of 1.98 acre-feet a year from September 16 to April 30, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion described as follows:

Water measurement conditions:


- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device, as approved by the Director, in good working order, at each new point of diversion.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where any meter or measuring device are located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The water user shall operate and maintain fish screen at the new point of diversion consistent with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's operational and maintenance standards.

The right to the use of water for the above purposes is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION, PLACE OF USE and CHARACTER OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered March 9, 2015, at Special Order Volume 95, Page 200, approving Transfer Application T-11645, and together with Certificate 89994, supercedes Certificate 68374, State record of Water Right Certificates.
