 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

confirms the right to use the waters of TWO WELLS, a tributary of EAST BIRCH CREEK for IRRIGATION of 7.1 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-5047. The date of priority is MARCH 17, 1972. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.04 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The wells are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Water use measurement conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain a totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director in good working order at each point of appropriation (new and existing).
- B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of appropriation, together with that diverted at the original point of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of appropriation.


Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.

Any well drilled under this right shall be open to a single aquifer in the Columbia River Basalt Group and shall meet applicable well construction standards (OAR 690-200 and OAR 690-210). The open interval in the well shall be limited to water-bearing zones with hydraulic head elevations similar to the zones developed by the authorized point of appropriation on water right certificate 42342 (UMAT 105). If a water-bearing zone with a distinct and different head is encountered, it shall be sealed off during drilling.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm an ADDITIONAL POINT OF APPROPRIATION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered SEPTEMBER 20, 2022, at Special Order Volume 125, Page 733, approving Transfer Application T-13870, and together with Certificate 96392, supersedes Certificate 42342, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
