## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

GARY AND KENDRA WEST PO BOX 2231 WHITE CITY, OR 97503

confirms the right to use the waters of SOUTH FORK LITTLE BUTTE CREEK, tributary to LITTLE BUTTE CREEK for IRRIGATION of 6.8 ACRES.

The right was perfected under Permit S-3727. The date of priority is MARCH 7, 1918. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used, and shall not exceed 0.09 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

Water use measurement conditions:

a. Prior to October 1, 2025, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at each point of diversion, with the exception that water rights issued to the Bureau of Reclamation or an irrigation district (or similar entity) are not subject to this condition.

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

- b. The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order.
- c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

Prior to October 1, 2025, the water user shall install a fish screening and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the new point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) design and construction standards. Prior to installation, the water user shall obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screen and/or by-pass device meets ODFW's criteria. Prior to submitting a Claim of Beneficial Use, the water user must obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screening and/or by-pass device was installed to the state's criteria. The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards.

The water user shall maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable measuring device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted.

This certificate is issued to confirm an HISTORIC CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered provided and approving Transfer Application T- 14193, and supersedes Certificate 87044, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in reference to ORS 540.610.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
