# CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

## THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

JAAW LLC 61141 S HWY 97 PMB 417 BEND OR 97702

confirms the right to use the waters of ONE WELL in the DESCHUTES RIVER BASIN for NURSERY USE.

This right was perfected under Permit G-11126. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 11, 1989 AND OCTOBER 12, 1990. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.038 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), BEING 0.018 CFS WITH PRIORITY DATE SEPTEMBER 11, 1989 AND 0.02 CFS WITH PRIORITY DATE OCTOBER 12, 1990, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

Water use measurement conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director in good working order at each new point of appropriation.
- B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

When required by the Department, the water user shall-keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion described as follows:

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.

Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The use granted herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm changes in POINT OF APPROPRIATION, PLACE OF USE, and CHARACTER OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered NOVEMBER 21, 2017, at Special Order Volume 107, Page 191, approving Transfer Application T-12215, and together with Certificate 93398, supersedes Certificate 90952, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
