CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

BEN TAYLOR  
MITCHELL, OR 97750

confirms the right to use the waters of BRIDGE CREEK for the purpose of IRRIGATION AND DOMESTIC.

And that said right has been confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon of the State of Oregon for Wheeler County and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the STATE ENGINEER, in Volume 12 at page 388, that the priority of the right thereby confirmed dates from 1868;

The amount of water to which such right is entitled; for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed one-fortieth of one cubic foot per second per acre of and irrigated before June 15, and one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre after June 15, during the irrigation season from March 1 to October 1 of each year, measured at the point of diversion from the stream.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate describes that portion of water right Certificate 13593, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered OCT 31 2025, approving Transfer Application T-14158.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
