confirms the right to use the waters of FOUR WELLS, tributary of DOVE CREEK, for IRRIGATION of 54.6 ACRES.

This right was perfected under permit G-7050. The date of priority is NOVEMBER 22, 1976. The amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.68 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the wells.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Water use measurement conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain a totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director in good working order at each point of appropriation (new and existing).
- B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional points of appropriation (Well 1, Well 3, and Well 4), together with that diverted at the original point of appropriation (Well 2 (Koch Well 1)), shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of appropriation (Well 2 (Koch Well 1)).

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to lands or place of use herein described.

This certificate is issued to confirm ADDITIONAL POINTS OF APPROPRIATION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered JUNE 30, 2021, at Special Order Volume 120, Page 1027, approving Transfer Application T-13425, supersedes Certificate 52594, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
