CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

SHAWN STALCUP KARENA STALCUP PO BOX 696 BURNS OR 97720

confirms the right to use the waters of WELL 1, WELL 2, AND WELL 3 in the SILVIES RIVER BASIN for IRRIGATION of 59.4 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-11785. The date of priority is APRIL 1, 1991. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.38 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), being 0.17 CFS from Well 1, 0.21 CFS from Well 2, and 0.38 CFS from Well 3, not to exceed a cumulative total of 0.38 CFS from the wells, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the wells.

The wells are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The period of allowed use is March 1 through October 31.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Water use measurement conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain a totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director in good working order at each point of appropriation (new and existing), shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month, and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the water user to report general water-use information, including the place and nature of the use of water under the right.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The wells shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance for Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an airline and pressure gauge to determine the water level elevation in the well at all times.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of appropriation (Well 3), together with that diverted at the original points of appropriation (Well 1- Coleman and Frisbie, and Well 2 - Cox), shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of appropriation (Well 1 - Coleman and Frisbie, and Well 2 - Cox).

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.

The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of the water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.

The right to use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm changes in ADDITIONAL POINT OF APPROPRIATION and PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered JANUARY 15, 2020, at Special Order Volume 114, Page 883, approving Transfer Application T-12889, and together with Certificate 94800, supersedes Certificate 93830, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
