CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of WILLOW CREEK, a tributary of COLUMBIA RIVER for IRRIGATION of 17.5 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Morrow County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 1, at Page 73. The date of priority is 1883.

The right is limited to no more than 0.26 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, if available at the original points of diversion; SW NE and SE SE, Section 1, T2S, R25E, W.M.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-SIXTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

Water use measurement conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director in good working order at each new point of diversion.
- B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of diversion, together with that diverted at the original points of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion.

In order to avoid enlargement of the right or injury to other rights, it is preferable to have a flowmeter installed that reads instantaneous, totalizes, and has real-time access so the Watermaster can access the flow data. However, if the flowmeter will not work and provide the real time data, the Watermaster can approve an alternative type of measuring device that will provide instantaneous data, totalizes, and will provide real time access to the flow data.


The water user shall maintain a headgate to control and regulate the quantity of water diverted as required by the Department.

The water user shall operate and maintain the fish screen at the new point of diversion consistent with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.

This certificate describes that portion of water right Certificate 96670, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered AUG 28 2024, approving Transfer Application T-14237.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment. The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
