CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

STATE OF OREGON
WATER RESOURCES DEPARTMENT

confirms the right to use the waters of THE JOHN DAY RIVER, a tributary of THE COLUMBIA RIVER, for INSTREAM USE for conservation, maintenance and enhancement of aquatic and fish life, wildlife, fish and wildlife habitat, and other ecological values.

This right was perfected under Permit S-41913. The date of priority is MAY 10, 1977, plus one minute. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used, and shall not exceed 0.11 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source, from APRIL 1 THROUGH JULY 16, further limited to an annual volume of 23.4 ACRE-FEET.

The description of the stream point in which flows are to be maintained is as follows:

8 S	19 E	WM	23	SE SW	1000 FEET NORTH AND 1600 FEET EAST FROM THE SW CORNER OF SECTION 23

Water rights upstream of the original point of diversion shall not be subject to regulation for flows in excess of the quantities to which this instream water right is entitled at the original point of diversion.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled shall not exceed the quantity of water legally available at the original point of diversion.


The instream right established by this transfer shall replace a portion of instream water rights established pursuant to ORS 537.341 or 537.346 and shall be in addition to instream water rights established pursuant to ORS 537.346, 537.348 or 537.470, unless otherwise specified by a subsequent order establishing a new instream water right.

The right is subject to all other terms and conditions of Certificate 65295, and any related decree.

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

This certificate is issued to confirm an ALLOCATION OF CONSERVED WATER approved by an order of the Water Resources Director recorded in Special Order Volume 131, Page 117, approving Conserved Water Application CW-139. This Certificate together with Certificate 97849, Certificate 97850, and the conserved water under CW-139 supersedes Certificate 65295, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
