confirms the right to use the waters of THE JOHN DAY RIVER, a tributary of THE COLUMBIA RIVER for IRRIGATION of 0.6 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-41913. The date of priority is MAY 10, 1977. This right is limited to 0.02 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

This right shall conform to any reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:
