CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

YOUNG LIFE
PO BOX 220
ANTELOPE, OR 97001

confirms the right to use the waters of the JOHN DAY RIVER, a tributary of the COLUMBIA RIVER for IRRIGATION of 2.7 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-46859. The date of priority is JUNE 8, 1982. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.07 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 5.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate describes that portion of water right Certificate 83560, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered JUL 29 2024, finalizing Allocation of Conserved Water CW-140, recorded at Special Order Volume 131, Page 732. This certificate, together with Certificates 97857 and 97859 and the conserved water under CW-140, supersedes Certificate 83560, State Record of Water Rights Certificates.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.
