CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

WFR WATER, LLC

confirms the right to use the waters of the JOHN DAY RIVER, a tributary of the COLUMBIA RIVER for IRRIGATION of 10.6 ACRES.

This right perfected under Permit S-46859. The date of priority is JUNE 8, 1982. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.170 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (cfs), being 0.166 cfs for IRRIGATION of 10.4 ACRES, and 0.004 cfs for IRRIGATION of 0.2 ACRES, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-SIXTY-SECOND (1/62) of one cubic foot per second for IRRIGATION of 10.4 ACRES, and limited to ONE-FIFTY-SECOND (1/52) of one cubic foot per second for IRRIGATION of 0.2 ACRES, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre for IRRIGATION of 10.4 ACRES, and not to exceed 4.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre for IRRIGATION of 0.2 ACRES irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and is further limited to an annual volume limitation of 32.0 acre-feet per year. The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:



This certificate describes that portion of water right Certificate 83560, State Record of Water Right Certificates, REDUCED IN RATE by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered July 29, 2024, finalizing Allocation of Conserved Water Application CW-140, recorded in Special Order Volume 131, Page 132. This Certificate together with Certificates 97857 and 97858 and the conserved water under CW-140 supersedes Certificate 83560, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.
