confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-15762. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: COTTONWOOD CREEK, A TRIBUTARY OF NORTH FORK JOHN DAY RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: DOMESTIC AND SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 20.0 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.51 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), BEING 0.01 CFS FOR DOMESTIC AND 0.50 CFS FOR IRRIGATION

DATE OF PRIORITY: APRIL 20, 1944

The point of diversion is located as follows:

9 S	28 E	WM	18	SE NW	POD #2 - 2090 FEET SOUTH AND 1160 FEET WEST FROM N1/4 CORNER, SECTION 18

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, for each acre irrigated prior to June 1st and thereafter ONE-EIGHTIETH of 1.0 cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be limited to a diversion of not to exceed 1.0 acre-foot per acre for each acre for each acre irrigated during any month prior to June 1st and shall be further limited to a total diversion of not to exceed 4.0 acre-feet per acre irrigated during the irrigation season from April 1st to September 30th of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion described as follows:


The water user shall maintain and operate a totalizing flow meter, or other suitable measuring device as approved by Director, in good working order, at the new point of diversion. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meter or measuring devices; provided however, where the meter or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The water user shall maintain and operate fish screening consistent with current Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife standards. Fish screening is to prevent fish from entering the diversion.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION AND PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered February 6, 2018, at Special Order Volume 107, Page 617, approving Transfer Application T-11971, supersedes Certificate 17283, State record of Water Right Certificates.
