CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

GEO. W. JOHNSTON
DUFUR, OR 97021

confirms the right to use the waters of FIFTEENMILE CREEK, a tributary of COLUMBIA RIVER for the purpose of IRRIGATION of 112.8 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-9579. The date of priority is MARCH 28, 1930. The amount of water to which this right is entitled and hereby confirmed for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 1.53 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The use hereunder for irrigation shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:
