CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of WILLOW CREEK, a tributary of COLUMBIA RIVER for IRRIGATION of 17.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Enlargement Permit E-239 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with laws of Oregon and duly confirmed by order of the State Water Board of Oregon, made and entered of record in the Record of Proceedings of said Board at Salem, in Volume 1, at Page 329 on the 26th of July, 1919. The priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from MARCH 13, 1915.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.21 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The use hereunder shall conform to any reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper State Officer.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

Water use measurement conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meters or other suitable measuring devices as approved by the Director in good working order at each new point of diversion.

- B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen at the new points of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.

The quantity of water diverted at the new points of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion described as follows:



This certificate describes that portion of water right Certificate 95946, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered JAN 23 2025, approving Transfer Application T-14259.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
