confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Enlargement Permit E-62. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point(s) of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: INDIAN CREEK, TRIBUTARY OF JOHN DAY RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 24.7 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.309 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: JUNE 1, 1910

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Water use measurement condition:

- a. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter, or other suitable measuring device, as approved by the Director, in good working order, at the new point of diversion.
- b. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within the private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The water user shall maintain the headgate to control and regulate the quantity of water diverted, as required by the Department.

The water user shall not construct, operate or maintain any dam or artificial obstruction to fish passage without obtaining approval from Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW). The water user is hereby directed to contact an ODFW Fish Passage Coordinator prior to construction of any in-channel obstruction or prior to diversion of water that may create an artificial obstruction due to low flow.

The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the points of diversion consistent with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW's) operational and maintenance standards. Fish screening is to prevent fish from entering the diversion. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.

The water user shall contact ODFW if any issues arise regarding the proper function of the fish screen in John Long Ditch and/or the fish passage structure in Indian Creek at John Long Ditch during October-May.

There is currently an ODFW-approved and maintained rotary drum screen in the John Long Ditch and a lay-flat stanchion fish passage structure in Indian Creek. Contacting ODFW during October-May, if issues arise at these structures, is being recommended due to the uncertain nature of maintaining these structures during freezing temperatures in the winter months. Failure of the fish screen and/or passage structure would diminish the benefits derived from this water right.

Water shall be acquired from the same source as the original points of diversion.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION and PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered September 2, 2020, at Special Order Volume 117, Page 468, approving Transfer Application T-10898, and together with Certificate 95263, supercedes Certificate 85029, State record of Water Right Certificates.
