CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of the ROGUE RIVER, a tributary of the PACIFIC OCEAN for IRRIGATION of 48.9 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit No. 298. The date of priority is July 26, 1909. The amount of water to which this right is entitled for the purposes aforesaid is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.26 cubic foot per second or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to a ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated; and conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.
