CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

STATE OF OREGON
WATER RESOURCES DEPARTMENT

confirms the right to use the waters of SOUTH FORK LITTLE BUTTE CREEK, a tributary of LITTLE BUTTE CREEK, for instream use for conservation, maintenance and enhancement of aquatic and fish life, wildlife, fish and wildlife habitat and other ecological values.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Jackson County, and the said decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order of the Record of the WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR, in Volume 14, at page 498; that the date of priority is 1895, plus one minute. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially and shall not exceed 0.064 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND April 1 to October 1 and shall be further limited to an annual volume of 23.6 acre-feet.

The description of the stream reach in which flows are to be maintained is as follows:

From the authorized point of diversion at approximately River Mile (RM) 19.8:

To: the confluence with Little Butte Creek

Within the specified stream reach, the amount of water to which this right is entitled shall not exceed the quantity of water legally available at the original point of diversion. Stream channel losses and gains calculated based on available data and the use of water by senior appropriators will determine the amount of water to which this right is entitled downstream from the original point of diversion within the specified stream reach.

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The instream right established by this Allocation of Conserved Water shall replace a portion of instream water rights established pursuant to ORS 537.341 or 537.346 and shall be in addition to instream water rights established pursuant to ORS 537.348 or 537.470, unless otherwise specified by a subsequent order establishing a new instream water right.

The right is subject to all other terms and conditions of Certificate 76175, and any related decree.

This certificate is issued to confirm an ALLOCATION OF CONSERVED WATER approved by an order of the Water Resources Director recorded in Special Order Volume <u>\\\^33</u>, Page <u>\\\\\^38</u>, approving Conserved Water Application CW-142. This Certificate together with Certificates 98126, 98128, and the conserved water under CW-142 supersedes Certificate 76175, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
