CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

R. A. PECK
LAKE CREEK, OR

confirms the right to use the waters of SOUTH FORK OF LITTLE BUTTE CREEK, a tributary of LITTLE BUTTE CREEK, for IRRIGATION of 20.5 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for JACKSON COUNTY. The decree entered of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR, in Volume 14, at page 498. The date of priority is 1882 FOR 20.0 ACRES AND 1895 FOR 0.5 ACRE.

The amount of water to which such right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.40 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS) FOR THE IRRIGATION OF 20.0 ACRES AND 0.013 CFS FOR THE IRRIGATION OF 0.5 ACRE; MEASURED AT THE HEAD OF THE DITCH OR THE POINT WHERE THE SAME LEAVES THE NATURAL STREAM, FROM APRIL 1st TO OCTOBER 1st OF EACH YEAR.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate describes that portion of water right Certificate 76175, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered JAN 08 2025, finalizing Allocation of Conserved Water CW-142, recorded at Special Order Volume 133, Page 1638. This certificate, together with Certificates 98123, 98128, and the conserved water under CW-142, supersedes Certificate 76175, State Record of Water Rights Certificates.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.
