DRAFT CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

NORMAN BUTLER
ROUTE 1
BAKER CITY, OR 97814

confirms the right to use the waters of MILL CREEK and GOODRICH CREEK, tributary to POWDER RIVER, for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION of 92.3 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-1713. The date of priority is July 28, 1913. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 1.15 cubic feet per second or its equivalent, in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH (1/80) of one cubic foot per second per acre. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate describes the portion of Certificate 85403 NOT modified by an order of the Water Resources Director recorded in Special Order Volume 133 Page 846 approving a partial cancellation. This certificate supersedes Certificate 85403.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
