confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Right S-55273. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484 and ORS 536.075. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 183.484, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, right or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate within three months after issuance of the certificate.

Water Use Measurement, Recording, and Reporting Condition:

- A. The water user shall maintain, in good working order, an inline flow restrictor at each point of diversion.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the device; provided however, where any device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- C. The water user shall keep a complete record of the volume of water diverted each month, and shall submit a report which includes water-use measurements to the Department annually, or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the water user to report general water-use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the right.
- D. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative measuring and reporting procedures for review and approval.

The use may be restricted if the quality of the source stream or downstream waters decrease to the point that those waters no longer meet existing state or federal water quality standards due to reduced flows.

The water user shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening and by-pass devices consistent with current Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) standards. Fish screening is to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion while by-pass devices provide adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish.

As required by ORS 509.585, the water user shall not construct, operate, or maintain any dam or artificial obstruction to fish passage across any waters of this state that are inhabited, or were historically inhabited, by native migratory fish without obtaining approval from the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW). The water user shall either submit a proposal for fish passage to ODFW or apply for a waiver or exemption. Approval of the proposed fish passage facility, waiver, or exemption must be obtained prior to construction of any in-channel obstruction or prior to diversion of water that may create an artificial obstruction due to low flow, and the water user shall submit proof to ODFW that fish passage has been implemented per the plan, waiver, or exemption prior to diversion of water. The water user shall maintain adequate passage of native, migratory fish at all times (ORS 509.601) as per the approved plan, waiver, or exemption. If ODFW determines adequate passage of native migratory fish is not being provided, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that the Department regulate the use of water until the Department receives notification from ODFW that adequate fish passage has been provided. The water user is hereby directed to schedule a consultation with and ODFW Fish Passage Coordinator.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

Where two or more water users agree among themselves as to the manner of rotation in the use of water and such agreement is placed in writing and filed by such water users with the watermaster, and such rotation system does not infringe upon such prior rights of any water user not a party to such rotation plan, the watermaster shall distribute the water according to such agreement.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.
