confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Right S-52712. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the well(s). The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: KELLY CREEK, A TRIBUTARY OF JOHNSON CREEK

PURPOSE OR USE: MAINTENANCE OF A RESERVOIR, CONSTRUCTED UNDER RIGHT R-11957, FOR AESTHETICS, FISH PROPAGATION, AND RECREATION

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.026 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

PERIOD OF USE: DECEMBER 1 THROUGH MARCH 31

DATE OF PRIORITY: DECEMBER 20, 1993

The well is located as follows:

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The Director may require the water user to install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. If the Director notifies the water user to install a meter or other measuring device, the water user shall install such device within the period stated in the notice. Such installation period shall not be less than 90 days unless special circumstances warrant a shorter installation period. Once installed, the water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order, and shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device. The Director may provide opportunity for the water user to submit alternative measuring procedures for review and approval.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

- B. The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used, and may require the water user to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water-use information, the periods of water use, and the place and nature of use of water under the right. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point(s) of diversion (POD 2), shall not exceed the quantity of water available from the original point(s) of appropriation described as follows:

The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screening at the point of diversion, consistent with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife operational and maintenance standards, to prevent fish from entering the diversion.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land use goals and any local acknowledged land use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered July 9, 2020, at Special Order Volume 117, Page 40, approving Transfer Application T-13272, supercedes Certificate 86730, State record of Water Right Certificates.
