The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional points of appropriation (Wells 4 and 5), together with that diverted at the old point(s) of appropriation (Well 2), shall not exceed the quantity of water available from the original point of appropriation (Well 2).

Water use measurement conditions:

- a. The water user shall maintain, in good working order, a totalizing flow meter or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device at each new point of appropriation.
- b. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided, however, where the meters or measuring devices are locate within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.

To monitor the effect of water use from the wells authorized, the Department requires the water user to make and report annual static water-level measurements. The static water level shall be measured in the month of March. Reports shall be submitted to the Department within 30 days of measurement.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.

This certificate is issued to confirm an ADDITIONAL POINT OF APPROPRIATION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered May 27, 2014, at Special Order Volume 92, Page 632, approving Transfer Application T-11684, supersedes Certificate 52712, State record of Water Right Certificates.
