CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-43145. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point(s) of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: NORTH FORK JOHN DAY RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF THE COLUMBIA RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION of 20.1 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.5 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: MARCH 21, 1978

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 5.0 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of appropriation, together with that diverted at the old point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning of construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

The water user shall maintain a fish screen or fish by-pass device.

The right to the use of the water for the purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.

This certificate is issued to confirm an ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered September 30, 2004, at Special Order Volume 61, Page 626, approving Transfer Application T-9632, supercedes Certificate 75984, State record of Water Right Certificates.
