CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit G-11250. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the well. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: A WELL IN THE SQUAW CREEK BASIN

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 5.0 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.06 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: DECEMBER 17, 1990

The well is located as follows:

Twp	Rng	Mer	Sec	Q-Q	Measured Distances
14 S	10 E	WM	33	NW NE	672 FEET SOUTH AND 247 FEET EAST FROM N1/4 CORNER, SECTION 33

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity diverted at the new point of appropriation (well), together with the quantity diverted at the old point of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available from the original point of diversion described as follows:

This use may be regulated if analysis of data available discloses that the appropriation will measurably reduce the surface water flows necessary to maintain the free-flowing character of a scenic waterway in quantities necessary for recreation, fish and wildlife in effect as of the priority date of this right or as those quantities may be subsequently reduced.

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

When required by the Department the water user shall install an in-line flow meter or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water used. The type and plans of the measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

The right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer as the original point of appropriation.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to the beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF APPROPRIATION AND PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered September 19, 2002, at Special Order Volume 56, Page 995, approving Transfer Application T-9085, and together with Certificate 79636, supercedes Certificate 72242, State record of Water Right Certificates.
