CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-38387. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point(s) of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: FIVE RIVERS, A TRIBUTARY OF ALSEA RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION of 3.0 acres

MAXIMUM RATE: 0.04 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: JULY 9, 1973

The point of diversion is located as follows:

15 S	9 W	WM	6	SE SW	1314 FEET NORTH AND 1709 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER, SECTION 6

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion, described as follows:

Water Use Measurement Condition:

- a. The water user shall maintain, in good working order, a totalizing flow meter, or another suitable measuring device as approved by the Director, at each new point of diversion.
- b. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen at the point of diversion consistent with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife’s operational and maintenance standards.

Water should be acquired from the same source of surface water as the original points of diversion.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described and is subject to the existing minimum flow policies established by the Water Policy Review Board.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION and PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered August 12, 2024, at Special Order Volume 131, Page 882, approving Transfer Application 13871, and together with Certificate 97077, supercedes Certificate 49512, State record of Water Right Certificates.
