CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit S-53335. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the point(s) of diversion from the source. The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: HORSESHOE LAKE AND WILLAMETTE BASIN PROJECT RESERVOIRS, CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-5363, TRIBUTARIES OF WILLAMETTE RIVER

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 84.93 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 1.03 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND FROM LIVE FLOW AND NOT MORE THAN 104.8 ACRE-FEET (AF) PER YEAR STORED WATER ONLY, PROVIDED THAT THE TOTAL VOLUME OF STORED WATER USED UNDER THIS RIGHT TOGETHER WITH ANY AMOUNT USED UNDER PERMIT 53334 DOES NOT EXCEED 104.8 AF PER YEAR, BEING THE AMOUNT OF STORED WATER MADE AVAILABLE UNDER THE BUREAU OF RECLAMATION WATER SUPPLY CONTRACT

PERIOD OF USE: MARCH 1 THROUGH JUNE 30 AND SEPTEMBER 1 THROUGH OCTOBER 31 FROM LIVE FLOW; STORED WATER MAY BE USED MARCH 1 THROUGH OCTOBER 31 OR AS FURTHER LIMITED BY THE BUREAU OF RECLAMATION WATER SUPPLY CONTRACT

DATE OF PRIORITY: MAY 6, 1991

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of diversion (POD #2), together with that diverted at the original point of diversion (POD #1), shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion (POD #1).

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device approved by the Director in good working order, at each point of diversion (new and existing), shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month, and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the water user to report general water-use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the right.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

Water user may pump directly from point of diversion on Horseshoe Lake unless pumping causes substantial interference with more senior water right users and regulation occurs, then use must stop.

The water user shall maintain and operate fish screening and fishway passage as required by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife to prevent fish from entering the diversion.

The use of water under this right is subject to the terms and conditions of Contract No. 8-07-10-W1195 between the Bureau of Reclamation and the water user, or a satisfactory replacement, a copy of which is on file in the records of the Water Resources Department.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm an ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered January 26, 2022, at Special Order Volume 122, Page 366, approving Transfer Application T-13512, and together with Certificate 95940, supercedes Certificate 90098, State record of Water Right Certificates.
