confirms the right to the use of water perfected under the terms of Permit G-11338. The amount of water used to which this right is entitled is limited to the amount used beneficially, and shall not exceed the amount specified, or its equivalent in the case of rotation, measured at the well(s). The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

SOURCE OF WATER: WELL 2 IN SOUTH FORK MALHEUR RIVER BASIN

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 125.7 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 1.57 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND

DATE OF PRIORITY: MAY 17, 1990

The well is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation (Well 2), shall not exceed the quantity of water available from the original point of appropriation (Well 1) described as follows:

The water user shall maintain an in-line flow meter or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water user.

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer as the original point of appropriation.

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge to determine the water level elevation in the well at all times.

The Director may require the water level or pump test ever ten years.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF APPROPRIATION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered April 11, 2002, at Special Order Volume 56, Page 176, approving Transfer Application T-8540, and, modifies right perfected under Permit G-11338, at Special Order Volume 56, Page 176.
