CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

FESSLER FAMILY LLC
13009 MCKEE SCHOOL RD
WOODBURN OR 97071-9089

confirms the right to use the waters of SIX WELLS within the LAKE LABISH BASIN for IRRIGATION of 27.68 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-5915. The date of priority is AUGUST 30, 1973.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.35 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the wells.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Water use measurement conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director in good working order at each point of appropriation (new and existing).
- B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meter(s) or measuring device(s); provided however, where the meter(s) or measuring device(s) are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional points of appropriation (wells), together with that diverted at the original point of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of appropriation.

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm ADDITIONAL POINTS OF APPROPRIATION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered APRIL 26, 2016, at Special Order Volume 100, Page 319, approving Transfer Application T-12078, supersedes Certificate 89433, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
