CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

WILLAMETTE EGG FARMS
31348 S HWY 170
CANBY OR 97013

confirms the right to use the waters of THREE WELLS, A TRIBUTARY OF BEAR CREEK (WILLAMETTE RIVER) for IRRIGATION of 66.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-4046. The date of priority is MAY 29, 1968. The amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.826 cubic foot per second (cfs), further limited to 0.49 cfs from Well 1, 0.26 cfs from Well 2, and 0.826 cfs from Well 4, not to exceed a cumulative total of 0.826 cfs from the wells in any combination, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of appropriation.

The points of appropriation are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year; and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Water use measurement conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain, in good working order, a totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director at each point of appropriation (new and existing).
- B. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where any meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional points of appropriation (Well 1 and Well 2), together with that diverted at the original point of appropriation (Well 4), shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of appropriation (Well 4).

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.

The right to use water for the above purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.

This certificate is issued to confirm changes in ADDITIONAL POINTS OF APPROPRIATION and PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered DECEMBER 6, 2012, at Special Order Volume 88, Page 786, approving Transfer Application T-11366, supersedes Certificate 42788, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
